Export Power of Attorney Requirements

In an export transaction, we (L.E. Coppersmith, Inc.) when acting as an International Freight Forwarder, must have written authorization from a Principal Party in Interest to prepare and submit Electronic Export Information (EEI) via the Automated Export System (Known as AES) or other documents or records required to be filed to the Census Bureau, CBP, the Bureau of Industry and Security or any other U.S. Governmental Agency.

The United States Principle Party of Interest (**USPPI**) can provide this authorization to us by completing any of the below referenced documents: (Also See attached)

- ❑ Shipper's Letter of Instruction (**SLI**) for each individual shipment
- ❑ USPPI Export Power of Attorney (**USPPI POA**)-Covers all export transactions
- ❑ L.E. Coppersmith, Inc., Customs/General Power of Attorney- Covers all import and export transactions

CONSIGNEE ROUTED SHIPMENTS:

In addition to above, if a shipment is a "foreign consignee routed transaction," where the consignee at destination appoints L.E. Coppersmith, Inc. to provide forwarding services, we must have written authorization from the Foreign Principal Party in Interest (**FPPI**) in the form of:

- ❑ Routed Export Power of Attorney (FPPI POA)
